St. Michaels Trash Collection Policy

Revised September 12, 2012

Individual residential and commercial units receive the same level of service for trash collection. *Landlords are responsible for informing their tenants and are liable for infractions of the Trash Collection Policy.* ALL items described below should be placed at the curb *no earlier* than 4PM on the day before collection, and cans must be removed within 24 hours. *Part-time residents need to make necessary arrangements for their cans and bags so as not to violate this policy.*

- 1. Household garbage:** Collected once a week on Tuesday morning. Maximum two lidded cans OR two secured trash bags -- not to exceed 50 lbs. each. *No recycle items are allowed in the garbage collection.* **Cans exceeding 50 lbs will not be picked up.**
- 2. Mandatory Recycling:** Collected once a week on Friday morning. Single-stream service allows items to be placed together in the container provided by the hauler and sorted later. See separate sheet for items that must be recycled.
- 3. Bulk:** Collected once a week on Tuesday morning. Bulk items include furniture or appliances.
- 4. Lawn debris:** Collected once a week on Tuesday morning. Branches should be bundled and tied and not exceed 5'. Loose yard waste must be in containers or bags clearly marked "yard waste" or "leaves." Place lawn debris and brush separate from household garbage and bulk pick-up.
- 5. Violations and Penalties:** As set forth in Chapter 275 (Solid Waste) of the Town Code, violations of the above noted shall be considered a municipal infraction punishable by a fine of \$50.00. Each day on which a violation exists shall constitute a separate offense.

****Please note:** The town will not pick up lawn debris, grass clippings or construction and demolition materials generated by licensed contractors. Property owners are responsible for notifying the contractors.

The following items will **NOT** be collected:
